## June is Fatherhood & Men's Health Month!

Picture this: The feelings of the dads in your life are validated and valued. In turn, these dads are able to have healthy father-child, father-family bonds and relationships. You're probably wondering how this is possible... OhioGuidestone's Institute of Family and Community Impact's (IFCI) <u>Father's Feelings program</u>\_seeks to transform society's approach to paternal health by combining several IFCI innovations like our Yates paternal perinatal depression screening response and protocol and Joyful Together, our evidence-based practice that uses joy to infuse everyday moments. If dads' feelings are validated, we are another step closer to whole family thriving and vitality!

<u>Father's Feelings</u> provides fathers with clinical paternal depression screening, brief coaching and intervention, and warm hand-off referrals to clinical and other social and community outlets to fathers in the perinatal phase.

#### What is our Father's Feelings Project?

- This project offers Dads the opportunity to share their feelings and thoughts about their lives as parents.
- Offers ideas to strengthen father-child bonds.
- Dads get to explore their feelings around paternal perinatal depression.
- Helps prepare fathers for the joys and challenges of fatherhood.
- Can be a stand-alone, short fatherhood program -or added to current programming (e.g. therapy, groups, home visiting, fatherhood curriculum).

# NEW!- OhioGuidestone's Yates Paternal Depression Screening Tool has gone LIVE with our Cuyahoga County Home Visiting Programming!

Moms are commonly screened for maternal depression at their women's health visits, pediatrician well child checks, and even during home visiting sessions like with Help Me Grow. Did you know that DADS can be screened at these appointments, too? Our Cuyahoga County Home Visiting Team took our Yates Paternal Depression Screening Tool LIVE this spring. Two (2) dads who participated in home visiting sessions requested to be screened for depression and asked to be referred for more fatherhood and men-specific outlets.

This was our first step to take the Father's Feelings Project from a research study, to a tool to be implemented in community-based settings. By addressing dads' needs we are contributing to the improvement of whole-family health and vitality. Home visiting services seek to build protective factors for our children. With maternal depression and paternal depression being closely linked, we are able to strengthen the parent-child bond and whole-family health by implementing our culturally sensitive, carefully designed paternal depression screening tool. Taking care of dad has benefits for the whole family.
